Read to Succeed (R2S)

- Signed by the Governor on June 11, 2014
- Office of Reading to be established by August 1, 2014
 - Reading and Early Learning Team

Components of R2S

- Reading Plans (state, district, and school)
- 3rd Grade Retention
- Summer Reading Camps
- Interventions
- Literacy across the schools
- CDEP- Child Development Program (Early literacy and learning)
- Teacher preparation
- Reading Coaches



Reading Plans- State

- Must be approved by the State Board February 1, 2015.
- An advisory group will be formed to collaborate on the plan.
- The advisory group will be formed no later than October, 2014.



Reading Plans- District

- District plans will use the state plan as a basis for development.
- Pilot Plan Program with EOC
 - Can use these plans as a framework during the 2014-2015 school year.
 - However, the R2S office will provide guidance on the actual plan that will be required of all districts.



Reading Plans- District

- Sessions will be scheduled with district R2S liaisons to discuss the guidelines for the plans.
- Districts should create Reading Plan teams to write the district plan.
 - Possible team members:
 - Include those who are attending the SCDE Literacy Leader/Reading Coach Institute



Reading Plans- Schools

- School plans build upon the district reading plan.
- District plan must be developed first and then school plans work from that document.
- The school Reading Coach (for elementary) and Institute participant (middle/high) should lead the team at the schools in writing this plan.



Reading Plans

- We will post templates and other materials on the R2S website for districts.
- A date will be established by which the plans are due to the R2S Office.
- Failure to submit an approved district plan by the established date will result in loss of state reading funds until the plan is approved.



3rd Grade Retention

- 2017-2018
 - A student must be retained if they fail to demonstrate reading proficiency at the end of third grade.



3rd Grade Retention

- Guidance for this will be created during the 2014-2015 school year.
- Concerns:
 - Students with IEPs and 504s.



Summer Reading Camps

- 2014-2015
 - Students who are not reading proficiently at the end of the third nine weeks who are eligible for retention are required to attend a summer reading camp.



Summer Reading Camps

- Funding?
- Concerns:
 - Parents can opt out
 - Teachers
 - Transportation
 - Length of camp



Summer Reading Camps

• Guidance documents and informational sessions will be held in January, 2015.



• ALL students preK- 12th grade who are not substantially demonstrating reading proficiently in their grade level will receive interventions.



- Classroom teachers must provide interventions within the classroom and document those interventions.
 - Early Childhood and Elementary teachers must earn their Literacy Teacher endorsement.



- Who can provide these interventions outside of the regular classroom:
 - Interventionists
 - Must have their Literacy Teacher endorsement
 - Reading Recovery Training preferred but not required



- What is not an intervention:
 - Assigning students to a computer lab to complete an online program.
 - Requiring students to complete extra work.



Literacy Across the Schools

- Literacy competencies are being established and will be published by August 1st, 2014.
 - PreK- 5th Grade
 - Middle/High School Content Teachers
 - Middle/High School Reading (ELA) Teches
 - Administrators
 - Reading Coaches



Literacy Across the Schools

- These competencies will be the basis for all professional development and or graduate coursework that is offered in the state.
- These competencies are based on International Reading Association standards and best practices.



CDEP

- Child Development Education Program
- Early learning and literacy



Teacher Preparation Programs

- 2015-2016
 - Coursework required of participants who are enrolled in an Early Childhood/ Elementary
 Education teacher preparation program must include courses that cover the competencies for PreK- 5th Grade.



Teacher Preparation Programs

- 2015-2016
 - Coursework required of participants who are enrolled in an Middle or High teacher preparation program must include courses that cover the competencies for Middle/High Content Teachers and/or Middle/High Reading (ELA) Teachers.



Teacher Preparation Programs

- K-12 Programs
 - Currently evaluating the legislative requirements for these certification programs.



Current Teachers

• Any teacher who is currently teaching in grades PreK-5 must earn their Literacy Teacher Endorsement within 10 years of their most recent certification.



Literacy Teacher Endorsement

- Option #1
 - Enroll in a SCDE approved college coursework to complete the required 4 courses. (12 credit hours)
 - Successfully pass the Reading Praxis



Literacy Teacher Endorsement

- Option #2
 - Enroll in a SCDE approved professional development program and earn the 240 renewal credits
 - Successfully pass the Reading Praxis



Approval Process

- For all coursework and professional development
- By August 1st we will publish the approval process by which college coursework (virtual and face to face) and professional development can be approved.



Current Teachers

- Any teacher who is currently teaching in grades 6-12 must complete one college course (3 hours) or 60 renewal credits within 5 years of their recent certification.
- These courses and professional development will be created using the published competencies and criteria.



Others

- Principals
- School Psychologists
- Guidance Counselors
 - Required to take one college course (3 credit hours) or 60 renewal credits within 5 years of their most recent certification.
 - SCDE will be providing an online graduate course by which this can be accomplished (Participant will have to incur cost.)



What about?

- Those who have participated in:
 - South Carolina Reading Imitative (SCRI)
 - Project Read
- Those who have Reading Recovery certification.

Does not guarantee Literacy Teacher Endorsement. They may submit their transcripts for evaluation along with Request for Action Form.



Reading Coaches

- Three ways in which a Reading Coach can be hired:
 - Holds a Bachelor's degree or higher in Elementary Education and Literacy Coach addon certification or
 - Holds a Master's degree in Reading and pursing their Literacy Coach Endorsement or
 - Holds a Bachelor's degree or higher and are actively pursing their Literacy Coach Endorsement



Literacy Coach Endorsement

- Option #1
 - Completed Literacy Teacher endorsement.
 - Enrolled in courses that have been approved.

- Option #2
 - Enrolled in the SCDE Literacy Leader/ Reading Coach Institute or an approved professional development program for Literacy Coach Endorsement.



- My district has 4 elementary schools and each are receiving funding for a .50 coach. Can I hire 2 full time coaches to share among the schools? Yes
- The coaches that I want to hire are National Board Certified, will they still receive their stipend? Yes



• My district has 4 elementary schools. Two of them are receiving 100% funding and 2 are only receiving 50% funding. One school is Title I and one is not. What funds can I use to ensure that each school has a full time coach?



• My district has 4 elementary schools and 1 primary school. I am being funded 100% at 4 of my schools. One of my elementary schools has a strong assistant principal who will work with our teachers next year. Can I use the funding for that school to fund my primary school? Yes



- I have a school that will receive an allocation for 50% funding. Can I pay that coach out of other funds to be an interventionists for part time of the day? Yes, however the coach must still complete the requirements of the SCDE Literacy Leader/ Reading Coach Institute.
- Will the coaches receive the supply money? No



• My district has 4 elementary schools. 3 schools are 100% funded while one is 50% funded. What funds can I use to match the other 50% of their salary so that I can make them a full time coach? If your school is Title I you may use those funds. You may also use EIA Reading Funds, at risk funds or general funds.



Literacy Leader/ Reading Coach Institute

School level elementary reading coaches must attend and complete at least 80% of the requirements.

Inviting middle and high school participants (who a principal has deemed someone to hold coach qualities). There requirements will be a little different.



R2S Liaison

The person who was identified on the Literacy Leader/ Reading Coach Institute intent form will receive correspondence from the R2S Office.



District Level Administrators and Principals

• We will be holding technical assistance sessions with principals and districts on a monthly basis to provide guidance on the 8 components of the R2S legislation.
