An assessment map, part of our backwards-planning model, is a list of all the major graded and ungraded assessment devices you plan on using during a unit created before developing the rest of the parts for a unit of study. This information can be included as a portion of a syllabus or handed out as a separate document with each unit to students. The standards assessment map is not fixed and may be updated as the teacher and the students' progress through a unit. The goal is to know what assessment devices are planed for a unit before designing the rest of the instructional materials.

## The minimum information in the unit assessment map includes:

- 1. Name of the assessment device
- 2. Type of assessment device
- 3. Whether the assessment device will be grade or ungraded (0 or 1 weight)
- 4. Grading category where grade from the assessment device will be placed in Power Teacher
- 5. Points possible for the assessment device

## Grade book reminder highlights

- 1. Assignment weights are either 0 (non-graded) or 1 (graded)
- 2. If a category has no entries the categories with entries will be proportionally adjusted
- 3. If a Standard/Topic is not taught during a grading period it will not be selected as a category during the grading period and thus it will not be calculated into the grade.
